NCW in the Spotlight!

NCW students featured on the ITV "News at 10" this term as part of a ground breaking "Sound of a Masterpiece" project.

Amid a wave of excitement ITV News journalist Ben Chapman and a film crew visited our campus to speak with students about an extraordinary new musical project that's transforming how we experience art.

The visit centred around a multi-sensory album created specifically to enhance the experience of visual artwork for blind and partially sighted individuals. Partially sighted composer, Bobby Goulder, has reimagined iconic masterpieces - such as Leonardo da Vinci's "Mona Lisa" and Edvard Munch's "The Scream" - as immersive audio experiences.

Our students were invited to share their thoughts and reactions to the project, reflecting on what it means to experience art through sound.

This project

represents a major step forward in making the arts more accessible and inclusive - and we're thrilled that NCW students could be a part of it.





A Magical Trip to the West End:

"Matilda the Musical"

German Adventures


We're over the moon that three of our Year 8 students and staff had the trip of a lifetime in Marburg, Germany, visiting our partner school!

Year 11 student Zac said: "It was really informative – I learned a lot about different apprenticeships, which will help me in the future!"

Asal added: "There were so many different job roles to explore! Everyone was really helpful in explaining the details of apprenticeships and I also got great info about university courses."

A group of our Sixth Form students attended the **UCAS Discovery Worcester 2025 exhibition** at University of Worcester with Mr Radford and Mr Hinds. They had the opportunity to speak with representatives

from nearly 100 universities, exploring a wide range of courses and learning more about what each university has to offer to support their future aspirations.

Meanwhile, other students have been hard at it doing work experience. Ne-yo was able to secure a placement at the **Co-Op** for his work experience and Leo has been in his element during his work experience in the **NCW Library**. He's taking on several projects, including labelling and organising with accessibility in mind - a fantastic way to make a real impact. Finn has been able to contrite to two companies with his love of technology, completing two work experience placements in local businesses.

Carol, our amazing coach, has been working with our students for 10 years and is incredibly talented at making Judo accessible for those with vision impairments.




A huge congratulations to NCW students Len and Ellie for their outstanding achievements at the National Blind Shooting Championship in Wolverhampton.

Support Special Schools Campaign

Vinchel Lodge is officially opened!

This month we have had the honour of officially opening Vinchel Lodge, marking the completion of a major refurbishment of the ground floor of the Sixth Form accommodation.

We were delighted to be joined by Alastair Tulloch, trustee of The Vinchel Foundation, along with other guests, who were inspired by the newly renovated space, designed to provide a bright, accessible living area for students who are blind or vision impaired.

The refurbishment has been made possible through the generous support of The Vinchel Foundation, which supports people who are blind or vision impaired in the UK and internationally, along with their families and carers. The Foundation has a focus on education of blind and vision impaired young people and on the advancement of scientific knowledge of causes and

treatments for vision impairment.

The new ground-floor space features a three-bay kitchen area, carefully tailored to different sensory and functional needs, encouraging students to build independence and essential life skills. A newly added games room with a pool table provides a social area for relaxation, while the spacious main living area, complete with six sofas and ambient lighting, creates a comfortable environment for students to gather and engage with one another.

Alastair Tulloch expressed his delight in the partnership.

We are incredibly proud to support the development of Vinchel Lodge and to see the positive impact it will have on the students' learning and personal growth.
